## ***From.....RIVADAVIA, ARGENTINA, SOUTH AMERICA***

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Dear FAITHFUL supporters,

November is always a special month as it is when I celebrate my physical birth on the 5th as well as my arrival to Argentina on the 21st. I HAD BETTER ADD MY VERY HAPPY HOLIDAY GREETINGS TOO SINCE I KNOW I WON'T GET ANOTHER LETTER OUT TILL AFTER THE END OF THE YEAR!!! I have sooo much to say! I do wish you could be here to see it all first hand so make plans now.

I have been living in Rivadavia for almost 3 months now!!! Here is my mailing address there. I am now about 6 hours from Salta Capital city and actually closer to San Salvador, the capital of the province of Jujuy.

I love it there are for now I am living in a small room attached to the back of the church where I have a bed, table and chair. Such a nice simple life!!! I actually live more in the truck than at the church hahahaha! I am planning to get a video done of our ministry to try to get to you like I did last year. If you have computer access please look at either one of my two Facebook accounts or sign on to the page gira chaco salteño where there are pictures of our ministry. I do have to get Internet in Rivadavia soon! I can not drive 4 hours to send a letter or fill out a ministry report. I am going to see how much money there is in my fund at the mission to buy a computer and a modem next month....so pray for wisdom on which one to buy. I am pretty technologically challenged!!!

I went last week to Jujuy to get the truck tuned up etc. While I was there I was counseled to check out the brakes and three folks there mentioned the same place to go to get the work done. So I went there and the secretary said to come back early the next morning and I did. The owner was punctual and seemed very serious about his work. He told me what time he would be done and was actually done earlier! So I was sooo glad. I gave him some tracts and he said, "at my age I should be thinking more about eternity". I had Just brought two Bibles the night before and he did not have one so I gave him one. He said "I will never forget you, no one gives me anything". And I told him that God has the best gift for him that is Eternal Life. He said he would read the tracts and the Bible and I sent some young men from Jujuy to visit him and witness to him again and I will take him more literature when I go back next time.

On the 29th of Oct. Pastor Coletti had the first major activity at his new church building in Gonzalez. It will be a baptismal service for 5 folks. It was great to go to this event and see those who I worked with in Gonzalez. The church building looks great it just lacks a few details but God has been faithful. We have at least one promise of an offering for the roof on the church in Miraflores which is 25 km south of Rivadavia. We hope to get it all or mostly done on the 5th of Nov., it is my birthday so I am asking the Lord to give me the gift of finishing the roof so the people

from there can begin to have meetings regularly again. We will be having a soccer competition on the 12th of Nov. This was planned for Oct but it didn't take place so the referee is coming again from Tucuman. Pray for salvation of souls as we preach the Word to the teams participating. We had a special activity for Mother's Day which was last Saturday at the Ladies' Meeting, we were able to give each one a gift, the Lord provides!

We will continue our monthly trips into the impenetrable desert area, If it doesn't rain toooooo much (because the rainy season has already begun and we actually had hail during a preaching service in the plaza in our town when the folks from Tucuman were here). We also had a 6 point earthquake that day too, busy, busy, hahahaha! There was alot of damage in Jujuy near the Bible Institute there in a place called El Fuerte pray that God will use these things to reach the folks there. Also, the wall on the Catholic Church in Palma Sola cracked.

I want to go to Bolivia soon to see if I can buy two new rear tires for mud called Pantaneros or Todo Terreno or buy chains. I may be able to get new glasses and some dental work done there too as it is sooooo much cheaper there. But this all takes time out of the ministry. We would like to make another trip into the Impenetrable in Nov. This will be 19th pray for wisdom and for a driver and God's provision for this trip. We had such a great time on our trip last week! We had one decision for Christ in Santa Maria, a Young man 11 years old, his grandmother and great grandmother received Christ the last time we were there! Pray for his Grandfather Santo Catan, he has promised several times to come to the meetings but has not come. He does encourage his whole family to come which is nice, but he needs the Lord too. We only got stuck in the mud twice on the way back and my sweet companions from the Bible Institute in Jujuy and my pastor from Rivadavia took off their shoes and jumped out of the truck to push it out of the mud! At one point I was considering taking a tractor and tráiler instead of the truck but it dried out some and we looked for long cuts around the worst parts. The folks are sooooo glad you come to preach, as well as take them Bibles, Hymnals, magazines, tracts and other auto-discipleship material asweññ as clothes and food. They asked us for extra meetings and two messages at each meeting! Our guys were running out of preaching outlines hahaha,,,,,It is such a privilege to serve alongside these Young men and empower their ministry with transportation, food and materials! You all are a big part of that as I spent most of my salary on those things. Of course they gave us great meals as well as honey, fish and Ostrich (Zuri) eggs. They also caught a Yacare (small aligator type animal), a snake and a lizard. It is practically imposible to share all that we experienced in our trip in any letter. But we had 8 meetings for adults (with two messages at each meeting), and two for children (we gave them magazines and some sweet treats). We stopped at several homes and places along the way sharing with folks and leaving them literature. It was too muddy to get to the Egues Family pray we can do that again soon or send them some material as they are not saved. We were able to see several who made decisions in July and put Bibles and Hymnals and other materials in their hands to read and study. I was able to get two Giant Letter Bibles and several Large Print Bibles as there are many elderly believers in these rural areas and they can't read their Bibles any more. They were so glad to be able to see the Word of God! I have the best life ever really....God is sooo GOOD to give me sooo many privileges to serve Him and His people. I am super content to be in Rivadavia! When we got back to Rivadavia we were able to send the ambulance to Fortin Belgrano where we had been ministering as there was a lady there who is 6 months pregnant and has not seen a doctor at all, it is her third child and she had a very big infection. Glad we saw her and were able to help. Also, pray for Alfredo he is 8 years old and from what his dad told me he had a very bad case of flu when he was a baby and somehow that went to his head and it has afected his physical, mental and emotional development. He is a very sweet boy and his father has done all he can do and the doctors say there is nothing else to do for him. They live 7 hours from Salta Capital. I am going to get my friend who is a Special Ed. Teacher to evaluate him and see what she thinks. I would like to take him to get a second opinión too. He learned to walk at the age of 6 and is just learning some letters now at 8. I encouraged his sister to help him as they are far from anyone else to help. Pray for his salvation too, his father is attending a Pentacostal Church when they have meetings near them, I think mostly seeking a miracle healing for Alfredo. I witnessed to him and I don't believe he is saved, we encouraged him to make sure of his Salvation and read the Bible.

Alot of folks ask me if I am a Pastora (Pastor) cause there are some ladies in Rivadavia who say they are Pastoras....I tell the folks that, that title is not in the Bible, so no I am not a Pastora but a missionary and one sent to serve them. I am the only person from North America around here. Ok this is way toooo long and only the tip of the Iceberg!!! It is just one of those "You have to be here" things. But your support makes it all posible. The other day I roughly calculated that there are 1,500 square km of Chaco (desert, difficult, dry áreas to reach) in 5 provinces, Salta, Chaco, Formosa, Santiago del Estero and Jujuy. That is not counting Bolivia we are close but don't have the manpower. So we will concéntrate on Salta and Chaco and a bit of Formosa, we were at the tri frontier last week where those 3 provinces come together.

Two more things, Feliciana made a decisión for Christ while the Tucuman folks were here and so I want to start discipling her soon. Also, please pray for the salvation of a 86 year old lady, her name is Emilia she has never married and has no children. I personally witnessed to her 2 years ago at her home in a rural área, but she didn't receive Christ, others have witnessed to her too. Now she has been very ill and almost died, but after a couple weeks in the hospital and good food and we bathed her and perfumed her and pampered her as much as possible. She is not well mentally either, so I am not sure if she received Christ or not, she told my pastor "yes" but she generally answers everything with a "yes". She has to live in Rivadavia now as she has to use diapers and cannot walk. We have given her clothes, food and other ítems, like mosquito net, curtains, sheets etc. Her family has made her a makeshift hut to live in and they are making her meals, but she has no light in her place. We are going to try to build her a better place as the rain comes into the hut and you can imagine when it hailed and it was dark....I am sure she was scared.

When I go to do e-mail in the city I buy food at the open market, much cheaper, visit folks etc. I do read my e-mails on my cell phone in Rivadavia but it is very tedious to answer them on it!!! Ok, come and visit soon, you will never be the same.
