Understanding Objectively Is Better Than Egotistically

18b If anyone among you thinks that he is wise in this age, let him become a fool that he may become wise.

Proverbs 1:1-7

- **1** The proverbs of Solomon, son of David, king of Israel:
- 2 To know wisdom and instruction, to understand words of insight,
- 3 to receive instruction in wise dealing, in righteousness, justice, and equity;
- **4** to give prudence to the simple, knowledge and discretion to the youth—
- **5** Let the wise hear and increase in learning, and the one who understands obtain guidance,
- **6** to understand a proverb and a saying, the words of the wise and their riddles.
- **7** The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction.

- **Personally**, How One Views The World (Titus 1:9; Heb 5:14)
- Academically, How One Perceives Truth And Experience
- **Religiously**, How One Comprehends Religious Beliefs And Experience (Acts 26:27-28; 18:4; 19:8)
- Logically, How To Analyze With Reason (Isa 1:18; Rom 1:21-22)

Living In God's Reality Is Better Than The Web Of Self-Deception

19 For the wisdom of this world is folly with God. For it is written, "He catches the wise in their craftiness,"

Colossians 2:8

See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the basic principles of this world rather than on Christ. (NIV)

Acts 17:17-19

17 So he reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and the devout persons ... 18 Some of the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers also conversed with him. And some said, "What does this babbler wish to say?" Others said, "He seems to be a preacher of foreign divinities" because he was preaching Jesus and the resurrection. 19 And they took him and brought him to the Areopagus, saying, "May we know what this new teaching is that you are presenting?

20 and again, "The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are futile."

Boasting About Man Leads To Divisiveness

21a So let no one boast in men.

Jeremiah 9:24

but let him who boasts boast in this, that he understands and knows me, that I am the LORD who practices steadfast love, justice, and righteousness in the earth. For in these things I delight, declares the Lord."

Boasting About God Leads To Praise

21b For all things are yours, 22 whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future—all are yours, 23 and you are Christ's, and Christ is God's.
