2. Our Attitude: Covetousness Or Stewardship

^{15a} And he said to them, "Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness,

"put to death ... covetousness, which is idolatry"

- Colossians 3:5

For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God.

- He could only think of Himself
- He couldn't enjoy riches as God's gift

5. Our Accountability: Earthly Treasures Or Heavenly Treasures

²⁰ But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' ²¹ So is the one who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God."

6. Our Legacy: Wasted Or Purposeful

Luke 12:20 (NLT) "But God said to him, 'You fool! You will die this very night. Then who will get everything you worked for?"

18 I hated all the things I had toiled for under the sun, because I must leave them to the one who comes after me. ¹⁹ And who knows whether that person will be wise or foolish? Yet they will have control over all the fruit of my toil into which I have poured my effort and skill under the sun. This too is meaningless.
